Borough Will be Considerably Improved if Plans Materialize; Whitehead Avenue and Center Street Are Affected

SOUTH RIVER, Sept. 15.—Almost the entire session of the borough council meeting last night was devoted to discussions relating to improvement of certain streets in South River. Shows all the contemplated improvements he made it certain that the busy borough will be greatly improved and business enterprise will be more easily conducted on the local highways by reason of the fact that passageway will be more accessible in certain parts of the borough, where, in the spring and fall of the year, the muddy condition of the dirt pavement makes travel very difficult.
