COUNTY ELECTION BOARD TO CANVASS

Charging that a discrepancy exists in the election returns of the first poll of Raritan township, as filed at the county clerk's office and with the township clerk, County Solicitor Frederick E. Richardson, counsel for Freeholder J. Fred Orpen, will protest the granting of a certificate of election to Klemmer Kattelsen by the Middlesex County Board of Elections at its meeting tomorrow noon at the Court House to canvass the votes. There is a discrepancy of five votes between the two returns and the discrepancy is in favor of Mr. Orpen.
