GOVERNOR PUTS A CRIMP IN THE APPROPRIATIONS

RENTON, April 5.—After elimin-
ating items aggregating \$5,500 in the
general and supplemental appropri-
ations bills passed by the last legis-
lature, Governor Fielder yesterday
signed these measures, and they are
now laws. The supplemental bill be-
comes effective at once and the annual
bill will be effective on the first of
next November, the beginning of the
state's next fiscal year. The total
amount of state money appropriated
in these two bills is about \$7,500,000.
In the supplemental bill, the gov-
ernor vetoed an item of \$500 for Gar-
ner Cody, secretary and chief exam-
iner of the New Jersey civil service com-
mission for additional services during
the last year in connection with the
conduct of civil service examinations
for election officers. In the same bill
the governor vetoed \$2000, appro-
priated to defray the expense of a
commission authorized by the legis-
lature to codify the road laws of the
state.

Fielder has selected Lieutenant Colonel
Henry D. Syer, of Trenton, as his
appointee to the Commission to in-
vestigate the advisability of military
training in the high schools of the
State, provided by action of the recent
Legislature.
